

was named for Col. William Oldham, a Revolutionary War officer who became one of Jefferson County's early magistrates. Oldham County's 1824 boundary extended eastward to the Little Kentucky River, but in 1836 a portion was taken during the formation of Trimble. The county seat went from no-longer-existent Lynchburg to Westport to LaGrange and back to Westport before settling down in LaGrange in 1838.
